The symposium went very well and attracted a lot of attendees to hear the full programme of 13 lectures on Additives (attached) which can be viewed and downloaded from

The presentations themselves were wonderful with Graphene, the Fire retardancy presentations, and the first presentation at Chemsource from a Chinese company attracting very large audiences to the purpose built 75 seater lecture theatre on the exhibition floor. The organisation ran without a hitch apart from the IT at the beginning of Day 2 but our dedicated technician managed to sort that in 15 minutes. The feedback forms were very complementary about the symposium. All costs plus a Chemsource franchise fee were recovered from Mack Brooks, the organiser of ChemSpec Europe.
